# Literacy

# **Read Write Inc.**

- Children will complete daily Read Write Inc sessions. This includes: ٠ Building up speed recognising the set 1 sounds they know.
  - Continuing to write sounds and words.
  - To continue to read words and build up confidence in reading longer words and sentences.
- Children will be encouraged to recognise and write their name.
- To continue to learn their high frequency, reading them at speed.
- To write character descriptions of Supertato characters.
- Children will develop a love of reading through our daily snack and story time.
- This term we will focus on particular authors and develop the skills of reviewing books and discussing why we liked or disliked the book.

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- We will continue to develop children's confidence so they are able to speak to others about their own needs and interests.
- Children will continue to follow our classroom rules and routines.
- With support children will learn how to share and negotiate appropriately.
- Children will develop their resilience and independence when trying new activities.
- Children will continue to develop an awareness of their own ٠ feelings and how these can affect others.

- Children will learn a new skill of tye-dying. They will create a bright, colourful tshirts in celebrations of the Holi festival.
  - Children will design their own simple maps.
  - Children will use potatoes as a tool to create their Easter cards.
    - Children will use potatoes to print patterns.
  - Children will act out scenes from Supertato using vegetables as props.

## **Mathematics**

- Children will enjoy watching Numberblocks as an introduction to numbers
- Children will develop a good understanding of numbers 1 to 10. This includes:
- How to make these numbers, recalling number bonds

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- Can tell us what number is it in different forms without counting (subitising) \_
- Learning how to write the numerals for these numbers.

## **Understanding the World**

- Children will build on our knowledge of Hinduism and how they celebrate Holi, the festival of colour and the start of spring.
- Children will learn about Easter and how Christians celebrate this festival.
- Children will continue to look at the ways in which the weather is changing and what this means for wildlife and ٠ the natural world.
- Children will gain an understanding about what Fairtrade is and how we can support farmers all over the world.
- Using the story Martha Maps it Out, children will learn about different types of maps and how we can get information from them.

- This term we will focus on gymnastics developing on from the previous term the children will now more fluently and putting several movements together.

- Children will use their fine motor ability to form letters, words and numbers. They will gain confidence in forming them correctly.
