

YEAR 4 HOMEWORK TASKS

Spring Term

- The tasks described below are designed to be meaningful and enjoyable activities that you can do **with the support and involvement of other members of your family.**
- **The tasks, shown in red, must be completed.**
- You may then choose to do as many of the other activities as you wish - one, two or even all of them, it's up to you!
- Make a **scrapbook** to show evidence of the tasks you have done.
- Completed homework tasks should be handed in by **Thursday 30th March 2023 .**

Multiplication Test:

By the end of Year 4, ALL children will complete the new government multiplication test. To help children prepare for this test, please encourage your child to practise their times tables **regularly** at home and complete their weekend **Monster Maths challenges** .



Spellings:

Every fortnight, children will be given a set of 5 common exception words to practise spelling. They need to practise these as often as possible.

Regular Reading

Read daily to an adult or share what has happened in your story with an adult. Don't forget to return a signed reading record to earn some golden time.

It doesn't have to be a story. It could be a poem, a leaflet from a place you have visited; newspaper article or sports magazine.

Design and create an Anglo Saxon brooch. Find out what they were used for.



Enjoy a spring walk or bike ride! What first signs of spring can you see?



Learn to **cook** something! - Anglo Saxon Recipe

Find out about what the Anglo - Saxons ate and create a recipe book. Include 3 recipes. You could have a go at making one of these recipes.

Do remember to ask for permission and be sure to have an adult with you when you are using the oven, working with knives, etc!



Challenge yourself to **try another new activity!**

e.g. try a new craft;
learn a new gymnastics move;
try a new food...
