Attendance Matters




What is considered good attendance? Regular and punctual attendance is essential for effective learning, promoting positive relationships and developing good attitudes to education. **A child's attendance at school is expected to be 96% and above.** Anything that is below this needs to be addressed by school to ensure attendance improves. We need to ensure that all children attend school regularly as it is important for friendships and academic progress/success.

Key daily timings:

8:50 to 9:00 → Register takes place
After 9:00 → Late mark in register
After 9:30 → unauthorised absence

Healthy Packed Lunch Policy



How to pack a well-balanced lunch box - focus on the food groups

To be in-line with the School Food Standards set by the Department for Education, we feel this is a very reasonable packed lunch policy and one which we would like all parents to work towards achieving **one small change at a time**. We do understand that some children struggle with change but, the healthier choices you can gradually make, the better your child's health will be.

Packed lunches should include:

- At least one portion of fruit and one portion of vegetables every day.
- Meat, fish, eggs, or a non-dairy protein (e.g. lentils, kidney beans, chickpeas, houmous or falafel) every day.
- Oily fish, such as salmon, at least once every three weeks.
- A starchy food such as any type of bread, pasta, rice, couscous, noodles, potatoes or another cereal every day.
- A dairy food such as milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais or custard every day.
- A drink of water, fruit juice or smoothie (maximum portion 150ml), or semi-skimmed milk or skimmed milk, yoghurt or another milk drink.

Packed lunches can occasionally include:

- Meat products such as sausage rolls, individual pies, corned meat and sausages.
- Cakes and biscuits - but encourage your child to eat these as part of a meal and be mindful of appropriate portion sizes.

Packed lunches should not include:

- Nuts or nut butters (we do have children in school with allergies)
- Salty snacks such as crisps.
- Confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolate-coated cereal bars, processed fruit bars and sweets.
- Sugary soft drinks, such as squash and fizzy drinks.

Dear Parents

From September, children in Y5&6 will have the opportunity to have one-to-one lessons on a musical instrument.

Lessons can be on

piano

flute

clarinet (which could transfer to a saxophone as they get older)

trumpet (or another brass instrument) – if they already play

Lessons will be in school time on a Friday.

Costs are £10 per individual 20 minute lesson. This is in line with other schools or private lessons. If lessons are shared (eg 2 flute players at the same level), then costs will be cheaper. Children make most progress with an individual lesson, but it is possible to share.

Most brass instruments are available from school, and we have a few clarinets.

If they learn piano, they would need a piano or keyboard at home to practice on, and the same for flute, or clarinet. I can advise with hiring or buying instruments. As a rough idea, it's about £15 a month to rent for 3 months, which is a good idea to start with. Costs for buying range start at £180, but there is no expectation to buy until you know if they're keen to continue. Basic keyboards are cheaper, and are often for sale on local selling sites.

I am happy to do a short taster session on flutes or clarinets by arrangement, for which the charge is £5. These sessions may have to be after school, because it is better, though not essential, if a parent is there.





POLICE MESSAGE
Parking problems at drop-off and pick-up times

Dear Parent/Carer,

Concerns have been raised about parking around the school at peak times. Examples of poor parking have included blocked pavements, parking over dropped curbs, on zig-zag road markings and other access points. This seriously increases the risk of harm to children trying to safely cross the road, as well as causing access problems for local residents.

To help minimise the risk to children and ease the disruption to residents by those that park in this way, police will be conducting an operation to educate motorists on parking laws and if necessary, prosecute those who park illegally.

Drivers, who have not done so to date, are asked to park legally and considerately, away from the school entrances and only park against full kerbs.

Please do not park or pull over to drop children off in front school entrances, driveways, zig-zag road markings and dropped kerbs. Please also avoid parking in front of the pedestrian entrance to the school site. Failure to do so could result in a prosecution leading to a FINE or even PENALTY POINTS being issued for certain offences.

Please see leaflet accompanying this letter for details of road signs and markings which show where you shouldn't park.

What can you do to help?

There are a number of ways you can help resolve this community matter:

- Those living nearby can avoid the cost and inconvenience to themselves and others by walking children to and from school.
- Parents can consider lift sharing with friends and/or neighbours.
- Using the parking spaces on nearby roads which are often unused, would relieve pressure on areas closer to school entrance points.
- Allow yourself more time to find safe considerate parking.

Your help and efforts to resolve this issue is appreciated by the police and the school management. Your local policing team would be happy to discuss any issues or concerns you have with these issues.
