Teeth and Digestion

- ~ Some parts of the digestive system in humans
- ~ The different types of teeth in humans and what they do
- ~ A variety of food chains, naming producers, predators and prey



As Mathematicians we will know and remember:

Fractions – including adding and subtracting fractions, equivalent fractions and solving problems.

Decimals – including converting decimals, rounding decimals and dividing whole numbers by 10 and 100 to create fractions.

Measurement – including converting measure, solving problems, finding the area and the perimeter and telling the time.

We will continue to practise our times tables up to 12 x 12 daily.



As readers and writers we will know & remember Grammar

- ~ To expand noun phrases with the addition of ambitious modifying adjectives and prepositional phrases.
- ~ To use subordinate clauses, extending the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions
- ~ To use a comma after a fronted adverbial: Later that day, I heard bad news.
- ~ To use Standard English verb inflections accurately,

We will look at the structure of explanations, stories with a twist and character descriptions. We will apply this knowledge and our understanding of Grammar to write our own:

- Explanation text based on Wallace and Gromit Cracking Contraptions
- Story with a twist based on Jim and the Beanstalk

- ~ We will explore weather patterns around parts of Europe



As British Citizens we will know and remember:

Why is Easter important to Christians?

- ~ The events of Palm Sunday and the significance of the Last Supper
- ~ The events that led up to Jesus being arrested.
- ~ The events and emotions surrounding the crucifixion of Jesus and the events of the resurrection and to explore Christian beliefs in life after death.
- ~ The meaning of 'Messiah' for Jesus and to summarise the events of Holy Week.

- ~ How to experiment with creating mood, feeling movement and areas of interest by choosing the right materials and using techniques taught

As Designers we will know and remember:

Structure

- ~ how to strengthen frames with diagonal struts
- ~ apply techniques they have learnt to strengthen structures and explore their own ideas

As athletes we will know and remember:

As Musicians we will know and remember:
